IN SOME COASTAL INDIGENOUS CULTURES, transformation can happen between animals and humans, representing a dramatic change in one's journey. These stories are told at ceremonies where it is considered an honor for a person to wear a transformation mask, as well as viewers to bear witness to the physical and spiritual change itself.



Meeting Today's Needs

Seattle Indian Health Board (SIHB) is always evolving to meet the needs of the community. SIHB has been providing community-focused healthcare and programming for more than 50 years throughout King County.

Today, the organization operates clinics in the International District, Pioneer Square, and Lake City, as well as a mobile clinic. SIHB also operated a residential treatment program— Thunderbird Treatment Center—out of South Seattle for more than 30 years before pausing the program in order to find a new location that could accommodate more services and beds for residents healing from substance use disorder.

A New Home

In 2025, SIHB will reopen Thunderbird Treatment Center on Vashon Island as a \$36 million state-of-the-art facility.

Thunderbird will offer 92 beds and high-end amenities, including luxury rooms, a cultural healing space, an outdoor traditional garden, and customized community and counseling spaces. Residents will be surrounded by and have access to the natural environment and medicines that Vashon Island has to offer.

Community-Centered Care

At Thunderbird, SIHB will offer a 45-day intensive inpatient treatment program (ASAM 3.1 and 3.5) that blends innovative therapies with personalized treatment plans, tailored to each individual's unique needs and goals.

Residents will have access to behavioral health professionals, individual and group counseling, Traditional Indian Medicine experts, and outdoor activities, as well as access to ancillary comprehensive services, including psychiatry, Medication-Assisted Treatment, dental, pharmacy, primary care, and an array of human services.

Thunderbird will be offering a very unique and important addition to its programming. Fifteen beds will be allocated in a wing of the facility for pregnant or parenting adults, where they will have the opportunity to still be with their children as they complete the program.

This groundbreaking component is modeled after the Women's Lodge in Oakland, California. Operated by the Friendship House, this program has seen tremendous success for decades by keeping families together throughout their healing.
